February 27, 2018

The meeting of the McCook County Commission was called to order in their Meeting Room by Chairman Marc Dick. Members present: Ralph Dybdahl, Steve Gordon, Dean Koch and Charles Liesinger.

Chairman Dick led the Pledge of Allegiance.

Chairman Dick called for approval of the Agenda. Motion made by Koch to approve the Agenda as sent. Second by Dybdahl and motion carried.

The minutes from the February 13th meeting were sent to Board members for review prior to publication. Motion made by Dybdahl to approve the minutes for publication. Second Koch and motion carried.

Commissioner Reports: Koch reported on the Legislative Cracker-barrel held in Salem.

Michelle Zelmer, Hwy Dept Administrative Assistant, met with the Commission. Zelmer noted that the SDDOT bid opening for Bridge 44-210-177 (bait shop) was held with low bid from PCI Roads, \$306,395.67. The engineers estimate was \$253,562.20. DOT Transportation Commission will make decision to award or not on March 1st. Zelmer presented a utility permit for approval. Motion made by Koch to approve Water Utility Permit for Kingbrook Rural Water. Scope of Project: water service for hog unit. Location: SE4 Section 25to NE4 Section 36, Richland Twp. Second made by Liesinger and motion carried. Motion was made by Liesinger to purchase "Metal Pipe (culverts) & Metal Bridge Materials" off of Beadle County bid awarded January 16, 2018. Second made by Gordon and motion carried. Zelmer presented the TrueNorth Steel bid information to the Auditor for filing. Zelmer informed the Board that a consultant needs to be selected for the 2018 bridge inspections required by law to be done every two years. Motion was made by Liesinger, second Koch, and carried, to adopt the following resolution:

RESOLUTION 2018-03

BRIDGE REINSPECTION PROGRAM RESOLUTION FOR USE WITH SDDOT RETAINER CONTRACTS

WHEREAS, Title 23, Section 151, *United States Code* and Title 23, Part 650, Subpart C, *Code of Federal Regulations*, requires initial inspection of all bridges and reinspection at intervals not to exceed two years with the exception of reinforced concrete box culverts that meet specific criteria. These culverts are reinspected at intervals not to exceed four years.

THEREFORE, McCook County is desirous of participating in the Bridge Inspection Program using Bridge Replacement funds.

The County requests SDDOT to hire Clark Engineering Corp (Consulting Engineers) for the inspection work. SDDOT will secure federal approvals, make payments to the Consulting Engineer for inspection services rendered, and bill the County for 20% of the cost. The County will be responsible for the required 20% matching funds.

Geralyn Sherman, Auditor/Welfare Director, and the Commissioners reviewed Care of Poor cases. Two Notices of Hospitalization were received from Avera McKennan Hospital. An individual who received burial assistance for her husband asked for more assistance for other expenses incurred. Sherman checked with Kinzley Funeral Home and noted that the "extras" were requested by the family; request for more assistance was denied (2017-27). An Application for County Assistance was returned, waiting on copy of the individual's bank statement (2018-03).

Motion made by Dybdahl to enter into Executive Session at 9:55 a.m. to discuss personnel issue. Auditor Sherman and Michele Eichacker, Deputy Auditor, were present. Second made by Gordon and motion carried. Chairman Dick declared out of Executive Session at 10:20 a.m. Sherman and Eichacker will work with Karen DeLange, Alternative HRD, to put information together for a new hire in the Auditor's Office; duties to include HR responsibilities.

Auditor Sherman informed the Board that according to SDCL 24-11-45.1 whenever any county pays for the costs of confining a prisoner serving a sentence in a county jail; the county shall have a lien pursuant to chapter 28-14, unless all or part of such costs or charges are waived pursuant to 24-11-45. States Attorney, Mike Fink, has told the Auditor's office that a \$25 per day charge for cost of such confinement has been approved by Judge Giles. Effective immediately, the Auditor's office will begin to lien the cost of the prisoner's confinement including room and board charges; medical, dental, optometric and psychiatric services charges; vocational education training; and chemical dependency treatment charges.

Motion made by Dybdahl to convene as Planning Commission. Second made by Gordon and motion carried.

Tracy Hofer, Zoning Administrator, presented a plat for approval. Following review of the Plat Review Form, motion was made by Gordon, second by Liesinger, and carried to approve the following resolution:

"BE IT RESOLVED by the County Planning Commission of McCook County, South Dakota, that the plat showing Tract 1 of Hofer Addition, an Addition in the Southeast Quarter of Section 31, Township 102 North, Range 53 West of the 5th Principal Meridian, McCook County, South Dakota, having been examined, is approved in accordance with the provisions of SDCL of 1967, Chapter 11-6, and any amendments thereof.

The Board reconvened as Board of County Commissioners.

Motion was made by Koch to declare fixed asset #1018, Dell computer with monitor, as surplus property as it is no longer functional. Second made by Gordon and motion carried.

Cheryl Miiller, Clerk of Courts, joined the meeting, to discuss chairs for the Courtroom. Miiller noted that the chairs looked at initially, were on State bid. A total of 22 chairs will be ordered, 15 for the jury box and witness stand and 7 for the attorney tables, for a total cost of \$6532.20 delivered and installed.

Brad Stiefvater, EDS Director, informed Board that \$35000 grant request was approved for McCook County and all grant requests in the 8 County Region will be reviewed to determine which counties will actually receive their grant request. Stiefvater noted that the current quotes for security glass in some of the Courthouse offices aren't going to work; cost is extremely high. Stiefvater told the Board that the 8 first responder departments within McCook County (5 fire departments, 2 ambulance services, and Search & Rescue) will share the \$20000 donation from Dakota Access equally, \$2500 for each department. Each department/service will purchase safety equipment, present bills to Stiefvater and upon approval of purchase made, receive reimbursement.

Auditor Sherman informed the Board that the holdback, \$2307.42, for the 2015 water damage in the Courthouse will be paid now that the Intek claim has been provided for payment.
