The meeting of the McCook County Commission was called to order in their Meeting Room by Chairman Marc Dick. Members present: Ralph Dybdahl, Ron Scharffenberg, Bill Smith. Absent: Sheldon Butzke.

Chairman Dick led the Pledge of Allegiance.

Chairman Dick called for approval of the Agenda. Motion made by Smith to approve the Agenda with the addition of Joshua Henrich, SDSU student, at 9:30 a.m. Second Scharffenberg and motion carried.

Auditor Sherman presented letter from Governor's Office informing the Board that our request for funding from the SD Weed & Pest Control Commission has been approved in the amount of \$5,900.00. This funding begins July 1, 2014.

At the request of Commissioner Smith, Joshua Henrich, SDSU Math student, joined the meeting. Smith explained that Henrich has been working on compiling information and completing an analysis of McCook County expenditures and revenues and making comparisons to other counties. Mic Kreutzfeldt, Hwy Supt, Laurie Schwans, Register of Deeds, and Carol Lauer, Treasurer, were present. It was noted that there are many efficiencies to be found with a larger population base but McCook County was shown to compare well with counties of similar demographics.

Auditor Sherman, Mariann Oyen, Benefits Specialist, and the Commissioners reviewed and discussed Care of Poor cases. A Notice of Hospitalization was received from Avera McKennan Hospital (2014-15). Lien payments received the month of February were reviewed.

This property has been purchased by ISCO Inc % Buhler Ind for the appraisal price of \$499. Motion made by Dybdahl to approve sale and authorize Chairman Dick and Auditor Sherman to sign said County Deed. Second made by Scharffenberg and motion carried.

Auditor Sherman presented a Certificate of Adjustment of Tax List Item 2014-02 to the Board. A mobile home left the County in 2012 was not removed from the tax rolls. Applicant: Justin Zeeb.
