September 11, 2012

The meeting of the McCook County Commission was called to order in their Meeting Room by Chairman Sheldon Butzke. Members present: Ralph Dybdahl, Ron Scharffenberg, Marc Dick, Bill Smith.

Chairman Butzke led the Pledge of Allegiance.

Chairman Butzke called for approval of the Agenda. Motion made by Scharffenberg to approve the Agenda as sent. Second Smith and motion carried.

The minutes from the August 21st meeting were sent to Board members for review prior to publication. Chairman Butzke called for approval of same. Motion made by Dybdahl to approve the minutes for publication. Second Dick and motion carried.

Mic Kreutzfeldt, Hwy Supt, presented information as requested by Commissioners to follow-up the request for assistance from SD One Call. Motion made by Dick to require proof of membership to South Dakota One Call before authorizing permits to occupy right of way & underground utility permits. Second Smith and motion carried. Kreutzfeldt informed the Board that the County needs to select a consultant for engineering services required to participate in Countywide Signing project. This project is 100% funded by Federal Safety funds. Motion made by Dybdahl to hire Clark Engineering with Johnson Engineering as alternate in the event that first choice isn't able to complete work. Second Smith and motion carried.

Motion made by Dybdahl to convene as Drainage Commission. Second Smith and motion carried.

Mic Kreutzfeldt, Drainage Administrator, presented a drainage permit application, noting that downstream landowner signatures were obtained and he has signed off on it: D12-048 applicant Tom & Ron Stofferahn, legal description NE4 24-102-53.

At 9:30 a.m. the drainage hearing for Permit D12-049, applicant Thad Stofferahn, was held. Legal description: SE4 Sec 25 102-53. Kreutzfeldt presented permit application information explaining that downstream signatures have been secured except US F&W Service. Kreutzfeldt presented the Board with a letter from US Fish and Wildlife indicating that the Service is fundamentally opposed to the concept of draining by tile. Thad and Ron Stofferahn were present. Stofferahn's added that they are trying to control erosion with this project. Following discussion, motion was made by Smith to approve application when Justin Stofferahn acquires a permit for the N ½ NE ¼ of 36-102-53 or non-perforated tile be used when it leaves Section 25 102-53. Second Dybdahl and motion carried.

The Board reconvened as Board of County Commissioners.

Auditor Sherman, Mariann Oyen, Benefits Specialist, and the Commissioners reviewed Care of Poor cases. Two Notices of Hospitalization were received from Avera McKennan Hospital. Five Applications for Poor Relief Assistance were received from Avera McKennan Hospital. An Application for County Assistance was denied because the County did not receive a Notice of Hospitalization. A request to forgive a \$2000 lien for burial assistance was denied, Account #10230. Lien recoveries received the month of August were reviewed.

At 10:30 a.m. the Provisional Budget hearing was held as advertised. Mike Fink, States Attorney Elect, was present. Following discussion, motion was made by Dick to set States Attorney salary at \$33,000 and the States Attorney Secretary salary at \$19,000

for 2013. Second Dybdahl and motion carried. No other parties appeared for the

hearing.

Carol Lauer, Treasurer, and the Commission reviewed properties ready for tax deed proceeding. The Board reconvened as Board of County Commissioners.

Harland Technology would provide server hardware maintenance, network administration support and remote network monitoring. The Board asked Auditor Sherman to provide the dollars spent in 2011 and currently in 2012 for computer services at the next meeting. No action taken at this time.

Brad Stiefvater, EDS Director, met with the Board. Discussion was held regarding the burn ban and the need to keep it in force. Motion made by Dybdahl to appoint Brad Stiefvater and Brad Stiefvater, Jr. as Deputy Coroners and to appoint Brad Stiefvater Jr. as Assistant Emergency Manager. These appointments are volunteer positions and necessary in the absence of the appointed officials.

The August Clerk of Courts Report was noted and filed.
