

July 8, 2025

The meeting of the McCook County Commission was called to order in their Meeting Room by Chairman Chuck Mehlbrech.

Members present: Charles Liesinger, Tom Heumiller, Steve Gordon, and Marc Dick.

Chairman Mehlbrech led the Pledge of Allegiance.

Chairman Mehlbrech called for approval of the agenda. Motion Gordon to approve the agenda as posted. Second Liesinger.

Motion carried.

The minutes from the June 24th & July 1st meetings were sent to Board members for review prior to publication. Motion Liesinger to approve these minutes for publication. Second Dick. Motion carried.

Public comment: Roger Hofer provided public comments to the Board.

Commissioner Reports: none.

Conflict of Interest: none noted.

Auditor Sherman presented the Hwy Dept report in the absence of Travis Raap, Hwy Supt. Current projects include blading, chip sealing, and patching. Sherman presented Change Order No 1, for Contractor, Astech Corp, to adjust field quantities to actual quantities for Co Rd 09AB, microsurfacing project. This increases the project cost by \$74.76. Motion Heumiller to authorize Chairman Mehlbrech to sign the Change Order, which changes the project price to \$233,054.01. Second Gordon. Motion carried. Sherman presented Contractor's Application for Payment, Astech Corp, in the amount of \$233,054.01. Motion Dick to approve the payment and authorize Chairman Mehlbrech to sign the application. Second Gordon. Motion carried.

The June Law Enforcement Report and a report showing the breakdown of calls made and hours worked in each community were noted and filed.

Auditor Sherman presented recommendations from a Loss Control Survey to the Board. This included administrative, law enforcement, streets/highways, and emergency management. The Board has 60 days to inform SDPAA of actions they are taking regarding each recommendation.

A group of approximately 20 individuals were present for discussion regarding changing several miles of paved roads back to gravel. Anna Flogstad, Dir of Equalization/Zoning Administrator, Angie McCormick, Dir of Equalization/Zoning Clerk, and Mark Norris, Sheriff, were present. Chairman Mehlbrech apologized noting that the Hwy Supt had vacation plans and isn't here today. The following individuals provided input to the Board. Kevin Peterson: How did the County come up with the decision to change roads back to gravel? What is the Five (5) Year Plan we hear about? When were traffic counts done? These should be on Sundays when there are hundreds of vehicles on these roads. Auditor Sherman gave traffic count information that Hwy Supt Raap had provided to the Board (at an earlier meeting), to Chair Mehlbrech. Comm Liesinger: Counts cannot be held on weekends per SDDOT because that's not normal daily traffic. For instance, the Lake Vermillion area would be the largest town in McCook County if a traffic count was held during a weekend, again not normal traffic. Kevin Peterson: A blog says that gravel roads are more expensive to keep up; make repairs

to the first 2 miles. Are all 7 miles going to the Valley Rd being turned back to gravel? Jim Osterberg: Will the road from Center to the Valley Rd be chip sealed and what about Center to SD81? The County should be making improvements, not going backwards. Gravel roads were changed to oil roads over 60 years ago, so people had oil roads going to their churches. Comm Dick: The County can take care of gravel roads with less expense than oil roads. The board is planning to set aside capital outlay funds (\$2,500,000 over a 5-year period) for asphalt construction work to resurface highways. These costs exceed the funding of a single budget year. Kevin Peterson: We don't want gravel roads, keep oil roads. Ron Ecklein: I can tell you about the kind of traffic using these roads. Sun Prairie Baptist Church is a focal point and it's been around a long time, currently, with 116 families. Lots of events are held there. Gerald Schmeichel: If you can't budget for keeping paved roads, then you know the options. Kevin Erikson: want to clarify, County is letting trucks haul gravel on 245th St, so you get a new road through an agreement with the contractor because he's destroyed this road; disappointed. Gene Sandine: If maintenance had been done right the first time, roads wouldn't be in the shape they are. Why is the county chip sealing a mile N of Salem, when there's another paved road (SD38) 1 mile away? Spend money on the Center Rd instead. The gravel being used isn't any good. You guys are spending money where you shouldn't be and not spending it where you should be. Kevin Peterson thanked the Board for their time.

Motion Liesinger to convene as Planning Commission. Second Heumiller. Motion carried.

Anna Flogstad, Dir of Equalization/Zoning Administrator, presented a plat for approval. Following review of the plat review form, motion Liesinger to approve the plat. Second Dick. Motion carried.

BE IT RESOLVED by the County Planning Commission of McCook County, South Dakota, that the plat showing Tract 2 of Meadow View Addition, an Addition in the Northwest Quarter of Section 27, Township 102 North, Range 55 West of the 5TH Principal Meridian, McCook County, South Dakota, having been examined, is approved in accordance with the provisions of SDCL of 1967, Chapter 11-6, and any amendments thereof.

Motion Liesinger to enter Executive Session at 11:00 a.m. for litigation discussion, SDCL 1-25-2 (3). Second Gordon. Motion carried. William Garry, Cadwell Sanford Deibert & Garry LLP, Joe Jares, Claims Adjuster Claims Associates, Hampton Iverson, SDPAA Member Services Representative, and Mike Fink, States Attorney, were present. Chairman Mehlbrech declared out of Executive Session at 11:30 a.m.

Fred Butzke and Stephanie Albin, McCook County Soil Conservation District, reviewed 2024 expenditures and revenues for the district, with the Board, and noted a request of \$15,000 for 2026. Butzke noted that there is much uncertainty with Federal programs, thanking the Board for prior appropriations and on-going support.

Ann Richards met with the Commission, requesting that “no jake braking sign/s” be erected on SD262. Martin Barattini, two ladies from Bridgewater, Mike Fink, States Attorney, and Mark Norris, Sheriff, were present. Richards noted that this may not help, but she appreciates the commissioner’s time. St Atty Fink presented several “draft” ordinances noting that the legal description of the specific areas needs to be included in the ordinance verbiage. If the County adopts an ordinance, SDDOT then needs to approve placement of a sign, the county purchases the sign/s and erects them. Sheriff Norris added that jake brakes are a safety feature and if they must be used, so be it. Richards stated that she’s meeting with Bridgewater City Council tonight to ask for their support of a jake brake ordinance. Fink noted that the county or city can adopt an ordinance. Barattini added that times for excessive noise vary, but usually in the early a.m. hours. Richards told the Board that she’d bring a copy of the letter of support from Bridgewater City Council to them.

Dennis Ryckam, Factor360, and Mike Waldner, Dakota State University Director of SecureSD, met with the Commission to provide them with solutions to update cybersecurity and policies for strategic assessment. A checklist of solutions and steps to receive services was reviewed and discussed. Mark Norris, Sheriff, Kaylee DeVries, Sheriff Secretary/Dispatcher, Val Kremppes, Hwy Secretary, and Stacey Sieverding, 4-H Program Asst. Ryckam reviewed cost estimates for migration to .gov from .com and a website redesign project setup with the group. Waldner reviewed required program steps that need to be done immediately, if not already completed. Waldner noted that documentation to get things started has been completed by Auditor Sherman. Motion Dick to work with Factor360 in handling the website migration and the .gov migration for the County. Second Liesinger. Motion carried.

The meeting adjourned subject to call.
